

MARGATE

A SEAPORT town of Kent, at the northern extremity of the Isle of Thanet, a member of the port of Dover, 14 miles north of Deal, 72 east by south of London, and 18 from Canterbury. Some few years ago it was an insignificant fishing town, since when it has risen to its present height of fashionable celebrity, as a sea bathing place. The waters are limpid, the shore level, and the air very salubrious ; it is visited by a great number of nobility, gentry and citizens. The present buildings are found insufficient for the quantity who generally attend; new buildings are therefore erecting, and the town is rising into a higher scale of importance. The number of its visitors in 1822 was estimated at about 55000. Here is a very handsome pier, which is quite a fashionable promenade, and is very select in the summer, in consequence of a toll being exacted at the entrance. The town and harbour are exposed to the northern ocean, and on a fine day the ships passing along with a gentle breeze, entertain the eye and gratify the imagination. Here is a Town-hall, Market-house, a Church, which is an ancient and spacious building; several handsome Chapels for dissenters, Assembly Rooms, Theatre, Infirmary, a Museum and two excellent Reading Rooms, Bettison's and Garner's; these at suited periods are, as emphatically styled by a respectable author, “the High Exchange of Fashion”. Great quantities of corn are conveyed from hence to London, by means of Hoys, every Saturday. Steam packets also go daily to London, in the high season. Markets, (which are well supplied) Wednesday and Saturday. According to the census of 1801 the population was 4765, and in 1821, 7436.
